

**ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOMERDALE TO CREATE A  
GOVERNMENT-PRIVATE ENERGY AGGREGATION PROGRAM**

An Ordinance to Establish a Government-private Energy Aggregation Program (Option Two) in the Borough of Somerdale. In order to provide electric generation service, electric related service, gas supply service and/or gas related service and to provide appliance repair services for residential and non-residential customers pursuant to the Government Energy Aggregation Act of 2003 (PL. 2003, c.24)

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has been engaged in a process to establish a competitive market place through deregulation and restructuring of the electric utility industry; and

WHEREAS, the Government Energy Aggregation Act of 2003 permits Borough of Somerdale to become a "Government Aggregator" in order to provide electric generation service, electric related service, gas supply service and/or gas related service, either separately or bundled for the Municipality's own use and for use by residential and non-residential customers within the Municipality's geographic boundaries;

WHEREAS, residential and non-residential citizens of Borough of Somerdale have a substantial economic and social interest at stake in the purchase and supply of energy; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Somerdale hereby finds that it is in the interest of the citizens of the Municipality ratepayers, both residential and non-residential, to create a Governmental-private Energy Aggregation Program;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough of Somerdale be and hereby is authorized to become a Government Aggregator of electric generation service, electric related service, gas supply service and/or gas related service and to provide appliance repair services for residential and non-residential customers electric power on behalf of its residential and non-residential citizens; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Government-private Aggregator utilize Option Two of the Government-private Aggregator Program ("Program") pursuant to the rules and regulations of the New Jersey State Board of Public Utilities; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Borough of Somerdale is hereby authorized to take any and all steps to submit the necessary documentation to the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and to provide any and all notices to residential customers to opt-out of the Program and to non-residential customers to opt-in to the Program.
